
White Rabbit

Extended Entitlement Questionnaire. Have your say – Free childcare for 3 & 4 year olds (parental survey)

From September 2017, parents of 3 and 4 year old children, who work at least 16 hours per week, will be entitled to 30 hours per week free childcare in term time only, or approximately 22 hours per week spread over the whole year. Currently, parents of 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to 570 hours of childcare across the year, the government is extending this entitlement to a further 570 hours, meaning that from September 2017, parents will be entitled to 1140 hours free childcare. The Department for Education has asked the local authority to carry out a survey so that they can find out what kind of childcare families need in preparation for next year. You do not have to give them your personal details and you do not have to fill in the survey. They will share your responses with the Department for Education. If you choose to leave your personal details and if you complete the questionnaire, you will be entered into a prize draw. 1st prize is £100 of high street vouchers and a 2nd prize of £50 worth of high street vouchers. They are interested in responses from parents with children who were born between 1st September 2012 and 31st August 2014. The survey should take around 20 minutes to complete.
